# History of the California Gold Rush and the continuing search for GOLD!

# **By Mark Dayton**



This will be a visual presentation and spoken word history of what it was like to be one of the original gold miners in 1848 to 1865 here in California. Topics will include (but are not limited to): the pre-California history of the early settlers, the Spanish, Mexicans,

loggers, fur trappers, mountain men and soldiers who were here prior to the gold rush. He will explore:

- The arduous trip to California from across the plains as well as from all corners of the world by sea
- Early arrivals and settlements, surviving the weather, environment and many creatures of the Gold Country
- The railroad tycoons and merchants of San Francisco
- Col. Stevenson's Regiment of the New York Volunteers and their role before and during the Gold Rush
- The Chinese, Hawaiians, Chileans and Welsh miners and their significant contributions to the gold rush
- After the gold rush the continuing search for gold and the relics left behind by the miners.

He will bring some incredible artifacts and relics to look at as well and take any questions.

Mark Dayton is a local and published historian of the California Gold Rush. He is also a world-renowned professional treasure hunter and metal detector expert since 1984 who searches for treasures all up and down the West Coast of the USA. He is a retired Firefighter Paramedic and also spends his time as a busy professional musician. Mark is also a highly sought-after speaker on topics of history and metal detecting. He is the star of the popular YouTube Channel "Brass Medic", so you can join along on all of his adventures on YouTube!


## **Genealogy Work Group**


## **April 11<sup>th</sup> Book Club New Book**



The Island of Sea Women by Lisa See is about a friendship that begins in childhood between Youngsook and Mi-ja on the South Korean Jeju Island. Young-sook's mother is the head of the local diving collective, and she's expected to become a diver as well. Mi-ja's father is a Japanese collaborator, so she's shunned by the Islanders. Both girls train as "baby divers" so that eventually they will be able to earn a living for their families. In this society, the

divers are in charge of their families, financially and physically, while the husbands take care of the children.

Dispatches from the Cowgirl is a well-written personal memoir of an American family's experience in Africa. Told in short anecdotal chapters it highlights the truism that home is where the heart is and there is enough incident and personal detailing to provide a valuable insight into the life of a military family abroad—Indie Reader
